Hybrid Learning - Phase 1

Moderate

Student attend school in-person 2 days per week and work at home 3 days per week.

Classroom teachers will teach students using district standards-based curriculum and district instructional frameworks.

Limited on-site support will be provided to at-risk students needing a safe place to complete their distance learning requirements.

Chromebooks will be given to each student.

Hotspots/internet hook up will be available on a limited basis.

Specials and elective classes will be available with additional physical distancing and safety protocols.

Students will participate in recess both outside and inside.

Non-essential on campus visitors and volunteers including family members will not be allowed in classrooms.

During the first quarter, all clubs and extracurricular activities will be implemented in a distancing learning format if available. Students may participate in in-person extracurricular activities when they resume.

Students receive specially designed instruction based on the school site's hybrid schedule. Related services may include in-person and/or virtual instruction.

Social emotional support services will be provided in-person and virtually as available.

Student density will be reduced to 40% to 60% due to alternate day schedules. Classroom furniture will be spread out as feasible. Mixing of students will be minimized when possible. Lunches will be eaten in classrooms.

Students and staff will adhere to daily temperature checks upon entry into building or school vans.

Face coverings will be required for all students and staff.

Students will be required to clean hands frequently including upon arrival at school, before and after going outside, before and after lunch, after sneezing, coughing, or blowing nose, and before going home.

Students will be physically distanced as much as possible, increased sanitation procedures will be implemented, touch of shared items will be reduced, and procedures will be changed to increase safety. Meal pickup will be available.

Van will be sanitized at least daily, drivers and students will wear face coverings, and students should not ride the bus if they are not feeling well.

Students will sit two to a row with space in-between. Cleaning protocols will be increased to include frequent cleaning of high touch surfaces. Additional janitorial staff has been added to increase disinfecting schedule.

Safety protocols and distance learning expectations training will be provided for staff, students, and parents.
